8 Wider issues

8.1 Transport

B&NES is proposing to link up with Bristol, South Gloucestershire, North Somerset and Wiltshire as well as with areas further afield – from Poole and Bournemouth to the south and Gloucestershire to the north.

Together, these areas would form a new Western Gateway Shadow Sub-national Transport Body to speak with one voice to central government on strategic transport planning.

6. Upper Hedgemead Park narrows

Jeremy recommended that we should add all our support to Caroline Groome in her dealings with the Council, so that she can say that the CRA are behind her.

The proposed RTO had included the removal of some free parking spaces on UHR and others would be included in Zone 15 but the operating times were inconsistent with other parts of the zone. Objections had been raised to this RTO by Jeremy and Richard Samuel. A more comprehensive solution was needed to consider improved sight lines and/or priority signage. RS had suggested a site meeting with CG and council officials.

CG has written to RS and Steven Mildren in the Traffic Management Team to request a professional review of the junction so we all know what is possible. It can then be presented to residents for discussion.

7. Constitution

Jeremy had drawn up a draft constitution which had had contributions from committee members. The only thing outstanding was the question of proxy votes.

Jeremy explained why he thought proxy voting would prove to difficult, but Steve thought it was important where votes on controversial Issues were concerned.

Julie was also in favour of proxy voting. It would be carried out through one other resident, who would also be allowed their own vote, and the Chairman would have to be informed in advance and in writing.

A vote was taken and this was agreed. Steve was to provide a simple procedure for including in the constitution.

Subsequent to the meeting a workable clause to this effect has been included in version 0.5

8. Patch allocation

There was a discussion about the inclusion of Camden Row. The large block of flats there might prove difficult, but it was considered worth trying.

Deepali mentioned concerns about a planning application for more flats there.

The difficulty of contacting more people in Camden Crescent was considered and Jeremy and Nancy offered to help Deepali with this patch.


