Main points: 3.1 Some further consideration will be given to where the modal filter would be situated if the proposal goes ahead (one option is near/at the Parade) 3.2 BW suggested that the sign up box for the LTN campaign to be made more prominent as it was pushed down the page by the Coronavirus Help and Support panel 3.3 Further points raised about the options for cyclists and pedestrians, access for large recycling vehicles etc. These were acknowledged as important and "work in progress" 3.4 FB broached the matter of exactly what form the modal filter will take was raised and why only the bus-gate option was highlighted in the report; JJL said that other options such as rise-and-fall bollards will be considered by the Council – after all this is their programme now and will be leading the process further. 4.	<ul> <li>Sheep grazing</li> <li>4.1 JML summarised the main points of the update report, notably that the two most relevant and important Councillors for our case (Tom Davies and Richard Samuel) are very supportive and that others in the Council are coming around to the view that this is the most sustainable option for the land</li> <li>4.2 Furthermore, that the options appraisal, also pre-circulated, revealed the same conclusion</li> <li>4.3 An ecological survey conducted for the Crescent viaduct works has shown that there are active badger setts which would need to be worked around carefully; the potential sheep farmer (Geof Rudge) is confident that this can be achieved; further informal input from professionals confirms the possibility and even benefits of the co-existence of sheep and badgers</li> <li>4.4 The Council wants to see evidence of support and viability for the project, probably before any funding is made available. One option is to fund a trial ourselves, with Geof clearing just enough land for 2 or 3 sheep, at relatively small expense</li> <li>4.5 FB raised the point that it was unclear how the CRA, with no limited liability and limited funds for such a project, could pay for a first phase, and with whom such a contract could be made. CIL funding is still some way off. These are important</li> </ul>
